this life Nov. 1st 1896 aged 61 years & 3 months

### A Note from the Transcriber

The film I was working from was difficult to read. It was very hard to make out some of the typing.

The problem was that the pages were filmed without any blank paper between the pages, so that the image of the under page came through as a ghost image on the upper page. Also, the lighting wasn't good, causing the middle of the page to be light, while the upper and lower parts were dark.

Despite these problems, I think I was able to make an accurate transcription of the information on these images.
