
Causes of Death, Southwark Quaker Meeting Records

These are the causes of death of the people whose burial records I transcribed from the Southwark Monthly Meeting in Surrey, England. I recorded a total of 719 deaths, of which 566 had causes stated. The chart below shows the top 15 causes.

I was interested in studying this because so many of my own ancestors died of consumption. It turned out that consumption was only the third highest cause of death. The first two are more symptoms of death, and could have been associated with another disease. But consumption was still the leading disease in this sample, followed by smallpox and measles. Sadly, infant death was high, as shown by the figures for Gripes and Teeth, Teeth, and Stillborn. Teeth refers to the process of teething in young children.
